The top four designs from **Classroom Kouture 2025**, including The Gossip, will be proudly displayed at the Junk Kouture Dublin City Final, inspiring attendees with their powerful messages and sustainable flair.



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



KONKE Fastival of Fastival of CREATIVITY & CIRCULARITY

The Junk Kouture Festival of **Creativity and Circularity lit up** Dublin on March 3 - 4, 2025, marking the 15th anniversary of this global youth initiative in Ireland. The two-day celebration brought together over 200 students and educators from 20 nationalities. culminating in the Junk Kouture World Final on March 4 hosted at The Helix, Dublin City University.

Sixty finalist teams from Ireland, the UK, France, Italy, the USA, and the UAE showcased extraordinary couture creations crafted entirely from recycled materials, ranging from alpaca wool to window blinds. The standout design of the night, Aquacultural by Clodagh Ramsey of Wilson's Hospital School, was crowned Junk Kouture World Designer of the Year. Made from 2,000 mussel shells and weighing 32kg, the piece powerfully spotlighted sustainable food production and gender equality.

Bevond the catwalk, the festival featured immersive workshops and a guided city tour hosted by Dublin City Tours, which offered participants insights into Dublin's vibrant creative and sustainable culture. A highlight was 'The Creativity and Circularity Lab' on March 3, at the CHQ Building, focusing on growth mindset and circular entrepreneurship, with sessions led by industry experts and Junk Kouture alumni.

The designs were evaluated by a prestigious judging panel of experts including American eco-designer, climate activist, Global JK ambassador and author Maya Penn, Buying Director of Primark Sally Taylor, Parisian it-girl and champion of sustainable fashion Lise Pierron and fashion designer and founder of sustainable luxury womenswear brand SML London Stephen McLaughlin.

As Junk Kouture marked this milestone year, the Festival of Creativity and Circularity reaffirmed its mission to empower the next generation of changemakers through creativity, innovation and circular thinking.
